

HEVALIER YEAR MAY 2024

His life: "Come".

"Come follow me" (Mt 4:19), "Come and see" (Jn 1:39), "Come, all you who are weary..." (Mt 11:29). If it were necessary to define the Heart of Jesus, this single 'call to follow him' would suffice. Jesus became man, shepherd, stock, heart, but how would he reach his true dimension if he had remained alone? Jules Chevalier also offered his companions to follow him. "In those seminary days, he organised an association among the most fervent students, which was called the association of the 'Knights of the Sacred Heart' - Chevaliers du Sacré-Coeur" (Jules Chevalier. A man with a mission. E.J. Cuskelly, msc. p. 11). Like Christ, how would he reach his true dimension if he had remained alone?

"Come, 'well-spoken'...".

Christ, whose Heart is the "word" that speaks faithfully of God's love, is the "well-said" par excellence. He is the "Heart of God on earth". God loves every person and the Heart of Christ beats mercifully for them. "We will discover the face of Christ in the poor, in the little ones and in all the victims of injustice and violence" (Const. 22), "Everywhere the Sacred Heart is loved" (Const. 5).

His words:

"The blood of Jesus waters our soil through a thousand channels; some are visible, others are hidden, but all are at work. For this, the presence, here below, of Christians consecrated by God in Jesus Christ would suffice; Christians consecrate the world..." (SCJ 244).

"This world of the elect must have its sun to illuminate and vivify it, its ocean to fertilise it, its treasures to enrich it, its king to govern it. Well, the Heart of Jesus will be all this too" (SCJ 119).
